The fund awards \$1,000 scholarships to high school seniors in Metropolitan Detroit pursuing a degree related to international studies at an accredited college or university.

Eligibility:

Applicants must

- be a senior in a high school located in Metropolitan Detroit
- reside in Macomb, Oakland or Wayne Counties.
- have a 2.5 or better Grade Point Average.

Special Consideration for:

Applicants who

- ✓ are active in school activities.
- ✓ are active in their communities.
- ✓ demonstrate strong leadership, and communication skills.
- ✓ are financially disadvantaged.

Applications are due March 1, 2017 by regular mail to the Greater Detroit Chapter of the United Nations Association, P.O. Box 44105 Detroit, MI 48224

Recipients will be notified by email and by formal letter on May 1, 2017

Procedures:

Applicant will

- Complete and forward their Application Resume, and attachments to the GDUNA Office. Resumes received after the deadline won't be considered.
- Showcase one of the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. Medium may include essay, video, song, or visual art.
- Provide proof of enrollment to accredited college or university from the office of registrar by the second week of course work. Payment will follow.

I. Write a resume that includes:

A. Your Personal Information

- Your legal name in full, permanent residence, phone number and email address
- The high school you currently attend and its address and phone number
- Your high school contact (may be the principal, a counselor or teacher)
- Your cumulative GPA and the number of credits required for graduation
- The number of credits you will have earned as of January 1, 2017
- The accredited college or university you plan to attend and address
- The date you applied and status at institution of choice

B. Your Aspirations

- Your career goal(s)
- The issues, needs or problems you hope to address
- Specific academic programs and plans that will assist in achieving your goal(s)

C. Your Achievements

- School programs and activities in which you have participated (such as clubs, publications, debate, dramatics, music, art, student government, sports)
- Jobs and kinds of work you have held, including summer employment
- Public service and community activities not listed previously
- Events and activities that demonstrate your leadership skills
- Awards, honors or scholarships you have received
