



Warren Consolidated Schools provides a variety of courses to meet the needs, interests, abilities, and career goals of each student. The district believes that student needs are the guiding force in offering meaningful high school courses and programs.

In addition to fulfilling graduation requirements, students should also consider several other factors when selecting courses:

- What courses will help me develop my career or occupational interests?
- What courses will prepare me for the college, technical, or vocational training programs of my interest?
- What courses are of special interest to me?
- What courses will be good for me at this time of my life?

Students will use this guide to complete the 2017-2018 Scheduling Card for grades 10, 11, and 12. Counselors will meet with each student to review career interests and course selections.

### **Front Cover – Career Interests, and Graduation Requirements**

1. Fill in all identifying information: name, high school, due date (February 17, 2017)
2. Write your Career Goal where indicated at the top, check your Career Interest in the Career Pathways section, and check your Post-Graduate plan where indicated in the middle section
3. Review the Graduation Requirements and note which requirements you have already fulfilled. Students will also be provided with a copy of their most recent transcript for review. On the transcript, students will find a list of completed courses, total credits earned, and grade point average (GPA). If an error is found, please bring this to the attention of your counselor.

### **Inside – Course Offerings**

4. Browse the course offerings and circle your selections:
  - Circle your required courses in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies (refer to the Graduation Requirements on the front of the card)
  - Circle several electives that interest you; in place of electives, you may choose to re-take required courses that you failed
  - If you would like a more detailed description of a course, go to the counseling website to view a copy of the *High School Course Description Guide*, or stop by the counseling office for a paper copy.

### **Back Cover – Course Selections and Agreement**

5. In the table, write the course numbers and the course names of your selections. Remember that for full year courses you must write the course under both 1st Semester and 2nd Semester. See the example below:

6. Where indicated on the table, fill in additional courses of interest as “alternates” in the event that there is a scheduling conflict with your first selection; if you do not complete this section, your counselor may select courses for you without your input
7. With your parent or guardian, carefully read over the terms and sign where indicated



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## Special Warren Mott Programs

- **AP/Honors/Accelerated Courses:** once students commit to these programs, they are expected to remain enrolled for the full duration of the course; it is advised that students speak with their teachers, counselors, and parents before requesting these courses; after June 15, 2017 students may not alter their selections or “change their mind”
- **Career Prep Center:** CPC courses are considered “year-long” and may not be dropped; students will not have the ability to choose their preferred blocks
- **Cosmetology Program:** located at Warren Woods Tower High School; students must provide own transportation; current tenth graders may apply; two-year commitment; information on the counseling website  
If interested, students must make an appointment with their counselor by April 10, 2017
- **Early College of Macomb:** start attending Macomb Community College in the 11th grade and earn your Associate's Degree in three years; application deadline February 13, 2017
- **Governing Practices (Leadership):** applications will be available in April 2017; they can be found on the wall outside of room 101; please contact Mr. Bardelline or Mrs. Balasia for more information
- **Media Communications (Announcements):** students must apply to this program by March 3, 2017; applications can be found in the Media Center, the Counseling Center, or the counseling website; please contact Mr. Glaser for more information
- **Warren Consolidated School of Performing Arts (WCSPA):** auditions will be on Saturday, March 11, 2017; for more information on the program and admissions visit the counseling website
- **Yearbook:** students must apply to this program; applications can be found in the Counseling Center or on the counseling website; please contact Mrs. Arcori for more information

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## Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment is a program that allows high school students (usually juniors and seniors) to enroll in college courses for credit prior to high school graduation. This allows students to transition from high school to college easily. Students can get an idea of what college is like without being completely overwhelmed with a whole new environment.

**To qualify for Dual Enrollment, students must achieve minimum scores on the PSAT/SAT.**

The district may pay tuition for college courses that are: (1) not offered at Warren Mott; (2) not a hobby, craft, or recreational course; and (3) not a course in physical or religious education.

### How to Apply for Dual Enrollment:

1. Browse the Macomb Community College course schedule for available course sections. A link to it can be found on the Warren Mott Counseling website. Select classes that meet at a convenient time and location
2. Once you have chosen a course that meets at a convenient time and location, you must fully complete the following two applications and return them to your counselor no later than June 9, 2017.
  - Macomb Community College Application for Early Admission
  - WCS Dual Enrollment Worksheet (including “alternate” course selections)

Once your applications are approved, you will receive information by mail from Macomb Community College on creating an online account, taking a placement test, and registering for classes.
