- Students should have submitted their Free Applications for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by this time; colleges
 will send out financial aid award letters throughout March and April, and students will commit to a college on
 or around May 1.
- "Going to college" doesn't have to mean pursuing a traditional academic degree; it can refer to any additional learning you do after high school, such as job training, skilled trades education, & certificate programs
- Applying for college is a two-part process: completing the application on the college's website, and sending an electronic copy of your transcript to that college through parchment.com
- Many colleges automatically consider you for academic scholarships when you apply for admission; check the
 counseling website for a list of these opportunities; this bulletin lists scholarships for which a separate
 application is necessary
