## To Think About...

- Counselors will meet will seniors at the end of February to talk about financial aid and completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Some colleges will require your "seventh semester grades" or "first semester grades of senior year". Your transcript will be updated to include these grades by the first week of February. As before, please submit your requests through parchment.
- "Going to college" doesn't have to mean pursuing a traditional academic degree; it can refer to any additional learning you do after high school, such as job training, skilled trades education, & certificate programs
- Applying for college is a two-part process: completing the application on the college's website, and sending an electronic copy of your transcript to that college through parchment.com
- Many colleges automatically consider you for academic scholarships when you apply for admission; check the
  counseling website for a list of these opportunities; this bulletin lists scholarships for which a separate
  application is necessary
