Dear Students and Families:

During the week of October 26 – 30, Warren Mott will participate in Michigan's College Application Week initiative. Throughout the week, all seniors will complete at least one college application, if they have not done so already. So important is this event that most in-state colleges will waive their application fees during this week. Even though attending college may not be part of a student's post-high school plan, the process is applicable to many other life tasks, such as applying for a job or housing.

Additionally, students will have opportunities this week to learn about other topics related to life after high school, such as: accessing academic records or transcripts, application fee waivers, college financial aid, and a series of financial planning workshops that will include an introduction to bank accounts, and establishing and maintaining credit.

In order to fully participate in the college application process, students must be familiar with the following information prior to the event:

- Social Security Number, or Permanent Residency Number
- Current address, phone number, and email address

While you are assisting your student in gathering the above information, it is a good idea to initiate a discussion on how important it is to keep personal information safe and private, yet accessible.
