## Community

Additionally, students have opportunities to participate in online learning, the Early College of Macomb, and dual enrollment.

### School

### Curriculum

The academic program is organized on a traditional two-semester, six-period schedule. All students are required to remain enrolled in six credits per year and are expected to earn a total of 24 credits. Online learning experiences are embedded within various course curricula. For graduation, a student must earn a minimum of 22.5 credits and meet the requirements below.

# **Grading, Ranking, Honor Point**
