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ENACT SAT BOOT CAMP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

What is the goal of the program?

This 7-session program aims to teach students the best *approach* for each section of the SAT (Reading, Writing, and Math). Through learning a series of new approaches, students will be able to manipulate the SAT to play to their individual strengths. Students will learn these approaches, practice critical section-based strategies, and then apply it all on a timed assessment. Students will gain confidence in navigating the SAT and will focus their time and energy on the questions that will make the biggest impact on their scores.

This program primarily focuses on approach and strategy because it is the highest impact change students can make to increase their score. This class doesn't deep dive into the content of the SAT because doing so is actually the *next step* after approach and strategy have been mastered. There are opportunities in the book for students to practice content outside of class, which can be assigned by a teacher.

How many points can students expect to grow?

Students must set reasonable expectations when it comes to growth on the SAT. Students who attend all classes, are fully engaged, and take responsibility for gaining clarity on any questions they may have grow 60-80 points on the SAT on average after learning these new approaches. It is uncommon, the exception and not the norm, for students to grow more than 100 points in a 3-month period of time with targeted practice. The higher the score, the more difficult it is to grow a large number of points.

How is the class structured? What is covered?

7 sessions: Pre-Test, Pre-Test Review & Goal Setting, Reading Strategy, Writing Strategy, Math Strategy, Post-Test, Post-Test Review & Next Steps

The program begins with a pre-test to gauge students' current SAT aptitude. Students then reflect on their pre-test scores and set goals for the program. Then, we will spend about 3 hours per section (Reading, Writing, and Math) outlining the highest impact approaches and strategies that students will then apply to timed assessments. After the 3 sections' have been covered, students will get an opportunity to practice all approaches and strategies on a post-test. The final session will be an in-depth review of the post-test and provide next steps for students to continue targeted practice after the program is over. Students will be assigned homework throughout the program, no more than 1 hour per week.

What is EnACT's teaching style and philosophy?

We believe that learning is fun and our instructional practices reflect that—whether it's an SAT strategy game like Unfair Jeopardy or getting students to debate different SAT approaches in Would You Rather? We believe in building strong and long-lasting relationships with our students, which allows us to hold students accountable for *actually learning*.
